The Living Soil: The Good, the Bad, and the Crumbly

Soils for growing landscape plants have important physical and chemical properties we need to understand, but also key biological properties that are essential to root and plant health. Microbial populations are essential to soil structure and the development of soil aggregation. This session focuses on these living soil microbial properties and how to develop better soil structure, leading to enhanced plant health.

Top Twenty Questions of Plant Problem Diagnostics

Diagnosing how good plants go bad is a process and one of the keys to plant health management. This process involves asking the right questions about plants and the symptoms observed, the site, people who impact the site, the range of resources available to assist in diagnosis, and managing expectations about the prognosis of how serious the problem is and will become. Treatment without diagnosis is malpractice and determining what is truly happening is a key aspect of successful landscape plant health management.

Invasive species play a large part of our everyday landscape management. These invasives include plants, pests and pathogens, from invasive exotic honeysuckles to emerald ash borers to impatiens downy mildew. Jim Chatfield

Jim Chatfield is an Associate Professor and Extension Specialist with Ohio State University. He is a tenured professor in the Department of Extension and is part of the Department of Horticulture and Crop Science.

He is the Co-Coordinator of the OSU Extension Nursery Landscape and Turf Team. His teaching centers on plant problem diagnostics, plant selection, and plant pathology. Jim lectures throughout the country on integrated pest management, plant selection, invasive species, and plant diagnostics. He is a member of the International Society of Arboriculture and the Garden Writers Association of American. He holds degrees in Botany from Ohio University and Plant Pathology from The Ohio State University.



Joe Boggs

Joe Boggs is an Assistant Professor with the Ohio State University Extension in Hamilton County. He has more than 20 years of service with the OSU Department of Entomology.

Joe averages approximately 80 teaching presentations each year and is active in radio with the weekly “In the Garden with Ron Wilson” on WKRC in Cincinnati. He has been published in many formats including the American Nurserymen Magazine and the TCIA Magazine.

Both Jim Chatfield and Joe Boggs have been frequent speakers at the Indiana Professional Lawn & Landscape Association’s Summer Field Day and Winter Workshop.
