So let's take a step back and examine the basics that we may need to learn.

Perhaps we are not asking the right questions. We look at pesticides as individual applications but we apply them consecutively. We are told to rotate products but what effect does following one type of product have on the previous? New research may find a message in the bottle.

12:00 - 1:00 pm | White Grubs, Sod Webworms and Other Resurgent Pests of 2016

Dr. Doug Richmond, Purdue University

Clearly, we saw some resurgence of certain landscape pests in 2016. Serious and confirmed white grub infestations, sod web worm damage that looked at times like everything but, and other nastiness that seem to be making comebacks. The biology and management factors contributing to such a resurgence in the activity of such pests will be reviewed and re-examined for future decisions.

Dr. Hannah Mathers, Mathers Environmental Science Services

Such applications can increase the duration of efficacy for many herbicides. Dormant applications can utilize your staff during "down-time" winter periods. Dormant applications ensure that the herbicide is in place before weed germination actually occurs. Dormant applications optimize control of weeds that remain active in cold weather—problematic perennial and biennial weeds.


