

Pesticide Applicator License Renewals: Around the first of November, all commercial pesticide applicator license holders should receive their renewal information for 2023 from the Office of Indiana State Chemist. We urge you to open that letter immediately to be sure where you stand as far as required Continuing Credit Hours (CCHs) going into the end of the year.

Proper Maintenance Goes Hand-in Hand with A Proper Pesticide Application

Dr. Fred Whitford, Purdue Pesticide Programs

When thinking about a mis-application of pesticides or fertilizers, the first thing we consider is mixing, loading, volume, or even timing of the products used. But how often do we find that the equipment itself is simply not functioning correctly. Owning and operating spray equipment requires regular maintenance for the warranty to remain in force. Without proper maintenance, downtime caused can cost you hundreds if not thousands of dollars in lost revenue. Think about the cost of having to replace a piece of equipment that prematurely breaks down due to lack of maintenance. Think even harder on the potential loss of effectiveness of the pesticide application itself! Today's presentation will provide the latest science and technology of what it really means to grease a zerk or change engine oil.
